We held it at the Arcadia Village Hotel-Motel which is a great venue in a superb location with very good facilities. This year, we held it on the weekend of 20-22 July, a week before the start of the Australian Festival of Chamber Music on

27 July and some interstate participants stayed on in Townsville for the Festival.

Our tutors produced a fantastic variety of wonderful music from medieval rounds to baroque, classical and 20th century music. In Ruth's words:

We will explore music as far back as Robin Hood's England through the centuries where the recorder thrived as an ensemble instrument to the present day. Together through the music we will dance, laugh, lament and sigh as we explore and puzzle over many musical ideas.'

We did just that and had the best time. As usual, we ended with a short concert to share the pieces that we had worked on during the weekend.





2019 Weekend Workshop on Magnetic Island

Unfortunately, though, despite having 30 participants, we ran a substantial financial deficit on both the 2017 and 2018 workshops. For 2019 we are reluctantly increasing the fee by \$20 for 2019: early bird \$100 for members and \$120 for non-members (includes \$20 membership fee); and \$120 and \$140 after the early bird deadline.

The 2019 Australian Festival of Chamber Music takes place from Friday 26 July to

Sunday 4 August, while the Australian Vocal and Concerto Competition is usually held a week before the AFCM. There is always lots to do in Townsville in July and August: see townsvillenorthqueensland.com.au.
